Honeywell Successfully Completes Work at Swann Park



Baltimore, MD, November 19, 2009 - Honeywell and Baltimore City have been working together on the successful restoration of Swann Park. The improvements have created a new and improved park that neighbors, local sports teams and all of Baltimore can enjoy for many years to come. Baltimore City is now in the process of making final improvements and plans to reopen the park in spring of 2010.

Honeywell informed Baltimore City that it has successfully completed its work. The Maryland Department of the Environment has reviewed and approved the restoration, which allows the city to once again put Swann Park in use for recreation.

Honeywell installed foundations for lighting, dugouts, fences, bleachers, pedestrian pathways and roadways; regraded and seeded ball fields; and made water and electrical improvements. This work

has helped to expedite the final park improvements the city is making.

Honeywell has worked in partnership with Baltimore City to expedite the restoration of Swann Park. We are proud of our work and excited for the park's reopening next spring.
